BOYS AND GIRLS FOOTBALL TEAMS CONTINUE WINNING RUN



These are just some of the trophies won by our girls and boy's football teams over the past four years and that proud run continued when the boys and girls teams were victors at the Sports Partnership Cup held at John Leggott College in September.



The boy's team won five and drew one of their matches and topped the group easily winning the Sports Partnership Cup for the first time in two years. They will go on to represent our region in the next round.



The girls put in an incredible performance winning all 7 of their matches and scoring over thirty goals in the process, indeed every single member of the team scored and again they will represent our Sports Partnership in the next round.



The second round of the competitions were held at Wolfreton School in Hull. The boys found the competition tough, drawing one and losing 3 games to finish in 8th place out of the 9 teams there. The girls fared better losing to the eventual champions winning 3, drawing 2 and losing 1 game to finish in 3rd place. An incredible achievement for both teams to get so far in these competitions once again and we must thank the hours that all of our coaches give up for the team. So a big thank you to Mr Bates, Mr Lindsey, Mr Cooper, Mr Wooldridge and Mr Simpson. We are entered into the Iron Cup, the Humber Cup A and B teams and the May Day finals where we once again have entered two teams for each competition. We will continue to update after each competition.

AMAZING COMMITMENT TO HOUSE CROSS COUNTRY

We cannot thank enough all of the parents who supported the House Cross Country Championships which were held in 'trying' conditions at the Cricket Fields in Messingham in October. We had an army of parents who walked the children down and parents who had set the cross country track up and this was great preparation for the District Finals later in the month (more on that later!)



Our four houses Rowan, Maple, Hawthorn, and Juniper all raced against each other with the first 6 finishers counting towards the overall scores. In Year 3/4 the girls champion was Harriet from Hawthorn, with Isla 2nd and Poppy 3rd. The overall House winners were Juniper. In the 3/4 Boys competition the winners were Hawthorn, who also had the overall winner in Artie with Teddy 2nd and George in 3rd place.



The Year 5/6 Competition saw Annamae win the girls race, closely followed by Darci in second with Harriet in 3rd. The House Winners were Maple with their first five finishers finishing in 1st, 3rd, 4th, 7th and 9th. For the boys race Daniel was the winner with Elliott 2nd and Josh in 3rd place. The overall winners were Juniper and all of the participants who completed the 3 laps on the winning team received medals



MAJOR SUCCESS AT DISTRICT CROSS COUNTRY FINALS

We entered four teams for the District cross country championships all based on the results in the House Competition. Our Year 3/4 girls were up first and we had an individual winner in Poppy, a tremendous achievement, however that was not the whole story as Nora fell over at the start and was helped up by Lake from our team. Despite both girls starting a long way behind everyone else they performed magnificently to not only catch up but also overtake a number of children. The first 4 children from our team counted so Poppy came 1st, Harriet was 5th, Georgia 12th, Anna 13th, Lake 32nd, Isla 46th and Nora was 53rd. This meant that we as a team were District Runners – an incredible result and team effort which is a case of what could have been if Nora had not have been knocked over. The Boys Year 3/4

team were also incredibly strong with Teddy winning the race, Artie finished 3rd place and received a bronze medal George came 6th, Seth 10th, Dom 17th, and Elijah finished 19th in a race of 90 children. This meant we were crowned District Champions for the first time.



The Year 5/6 teams also showed incredible resilience especially the boys who really dug in and worked as a team finishing in 3rd place overall. The individual results were also promising in a field of over 100 competitors. Arthur finished 9th overall, Daniel 19th, Elliot 20th, Thomas W 27th, Joshua 30th, Thomas D came in 45th, with Cooper 48th. A thoroughly deserved bronze medal. Lastly the Year 6 girls really did get the team ethic with one of our parents remarking that it was reminiscent of seeing the Kenyan team in the Olympics as we had a train of runners all the way through to the finish line. Our strongest finisher was Annmae who came in 6th, Darci 7th, Harriet 10th, Niamh 12th, Isla finished 13th, Jasmine 14th, and Matilda in 17th. Phenomenal effort which also saw our girls crowned district Champions. Again this would not have been achieved without having so many parent volunteers and supporters who not only supported as team managers on the day with Miss Maxwell but also

cheered the children on, picked them up and drove them to and from the event. We thank you and are so proud of the children who took part.

We are very fortunate to have not only Lee Frecklington supporting our PE this year but we have also had Mrs Hutchings come into school to support with House Competitions and to assist in some lessons. She organised the House Netball tournament that was completed just before the October half term. Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 competed in these tournaments after participating in 6 weeks of lessons. The morning competition saw Year 3/4 take part in all teams played twelve matches of Stinger Netball. A big thank you must also go to Mrs Smith and Lyla who plays for Nottingham Forest Netball team. Hawthorn who won 6 matches, drew 2 and lost 2 were declared the overall champions.



In the Year 5/6 Competition there were some very close matches with only one point deciding the winners. Hawthorn again were the Champions winning six games drawing two and losing four. The House Captains did a magnificent job and the next tournament is going to be Tag Rugby at the end of the Autumn 2 term.

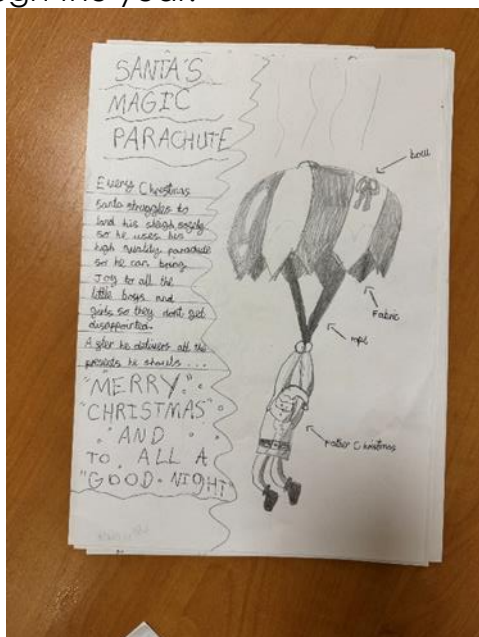
MANY ENTRIES FOR SCIENCE COMPETITION
