We have had some real success in football this year, firstly being the first team from Messingham to win the Scunthorpe Cup for almost twenty years and then we had the honour of representing Scunthorpe United F.C. in the Northern Section of the Football League pyramid where we met schools that represented York City, Bradford Park Avenue, Darlington and Blyth Spartans to name a few. This put the team in the quarter-finals where we played Spennymoor and we won this game 4-1 with goals from Jacob 2, Theo and Harvey. We knew the next game would be really tough and it proved to be with a 1-0 win against Scarborough. This put us in the final with the other group winners Darlington and they caught us napping by scoring two early goals to go 2-0 up at half time. Mrs Rose will be delighted at seeing how resilient the children are

as the deficit was reduced by an excellent goal from Theo and we had many more chances before Toby equalised with a minute to go. This meant the whole tournament would be decided by penalties. Theo took our first one and it was saved and Darlington went 1-0 up. Their second penalty was saved by Olly as Charlie and Jacob scored ours meaning it was sudden death. We all felt for Theo who had to go up and take a penalty again (and for anyone old enough it was a real Stuart Pearce moment as he scored and we all celebrated when their next kick was blazed over the bar.



This means that Scunthorpe (Messingham) go through to the next stage which is the Northern finals in Chesterfield on April 21st. A really big thank you must go once more to Mr Lindsey and Mr Atkinson who have been training the team all season. We do know this next tournament is going to be really tough, however the carrot for the winner is that they will get to be the half-time entertainment at Wembley for the Conference play-off final. Should we dream? I think so and even if we don't get there it has been a magnificent achievement.




UP THE IRON!!!



NEW VALUE = TRUST


