YEAR 5/6 WIN IRON FOUNDATION CUP FOR 2ND YEAR RUNNING



Last year we were fortunate to have unprecedented success in the Football tournaments we entered. The Year 5/6 team won the local League, the Humber Cup, the Iron Foundation Trophy, the North East Foundation Cup and became Northern Champions representing Scunthorpe at Wembley. We also won the Year 3/4 League and Cup, and the year 5/6 Girls team won their league!!! All thanks to parents volunteering many hours of their time to coach and support the school teams.



Four of the Year 5/6 team from last year are current members of the Year 5/6 squad that have already won the Humberside Trophy (a new tournament) and we defended the Iron Foundation trophy last Friday which is an excellent achievement as there are some very good sides locally. We drew with Brumby 2-2 in the first game before going on unbeaten for the remaining games beating Westcliffe 8-0, Lincoln Gardens 5-0, Berkeley 2-0, Kidby in the semi-finals 2-1 after being 1-0 down with only seconds remaining, and then

performing magnificently in the Final to beat Crowle 2-0. We had multiple goal scorers with Ruben being the top scorer with 6. Arlo and Toby scored 5. Kian 2. Kai 2, and Jacob 1 but it was a magnificent team effort.



Due to winning the Humber Trophy we will represent the Humber in the next round in the New Year in an East Midlands tournament and for winning this trophy again we go once more to York to play in the North East finals (where we know there are some excellent teams waiting for us). We may not have the same success as last year but we are so very proud of this team once more and all they have achieved so far. Training will begin for the 11 players in the squad once again after Christmas where we have more 6 a-side, and 9 a-side tournaments to play. We have also been told that due to the success of our football team the Girls Year 5/6 team will also be put forward to represent Scunthorpe in York on January 30th and we wish both of our teams well in their quest to move further forward in the competition.
